P.O.S.T. Modular Academy, Level II

This course meets all training standards governed by the Commission on the Peace Officer Standards and Training. A student must successfully complete P.O.S.T. Academy, Level III Module before allowed to enroll in the Level II Module. This is a highly demanding and rigorous curriculum; the academic and physical components and will require a significant amount of your time and dedication. - Students will complete documents within our website folders for **Mod II (2), 2a-2d – Pay Attention to Dates**
- Disqualifier document, PelletB scores and application documents will be reviewed by facilitators
- Su17 Mod III cadet application requirements will be minimal; requirements already on file and current
- In the event we exceed seat capacity, facilitators will determine the final roster with a score matrix (more information will be provided should this be implemented)

Wednesday, July 12, 2017 -- PelletB Exam, Room 2148, Check-In no later than 1645 Hours, Exam begins at 1700-2000 hours (30 minute proctor instructions, 2.5 hours for exam)

- Must pre-enroll by sending in the PelletB Sign-Up Sheet. Recommended: 42.0 or higher and 1 year current
- Exam is for students who want to raise scores, have and exam date past 12 months, or do not have a PelletB Score
- **IMPORTANT: Su17 Mod III students DO NOT have to complete the Academy Disqualifier; all other students MUST complete disqualifier, even if they WILL NOT take the PelletB exam**

Saturday August 19, 2017 – MANDATORY Orientation and Academy Day 1 – 0800-1200 hours

- Attire will be Class B Uniform (see rules and regulations)
- East Lot, Rm 2148. Each cadet will be required to purchase a semester decal for parking.
- Cadet orientation is scheduled from 0800-1000 hours; Cadet & Family Orientation will be 1000-1200 hours (families will not need to purchase a decal; no ticketing on weekend dates).
- Each student will need to bring LD 03 Policing in the Community for afternoon class (1300-1700 hours)
- Orientation details and clarification will be sent to each cadet prior to this date.



COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

SU17 Mod III Cadets:

Please see your RTO or Facilitator to have them review your current academy status. Then, submit the Instructor Verification document within the forms section. All below requirements are on file and should be current. You MUST also follow the same Application Dates. **You may stop here.**

Non-Continuing Students/Mod III Completion Transfer Students:

Each interested candidate will provide an initial application with proof of course requirements. Because we expect a high volume of candidates to the number of seats available, it will be very important to submit a COMPLETE packet to avoid immediate disqualification. The initial packet will require the following items; however, sponsored and/or endorsed students may bypass certain requirements due to employment/background process:

- Complete an Academy Application and attach all supporting documents. *See Task Completion Checklist for additional forms and requirements*
- Provide PelletB Exam Score, sign up for scheduled exam or provide sponsorship letter. It is *highly recommended* that all students attempt to score the baseline minimum of **42.0**. *This examination may be waived for agency-sponsored recruits.*
- Possess, without restrictions, a valid California Driver's License. Active Duty Military may possess a valid out-of-state driver's license without restrictions
- DMV Abstract-Copy of your driving record and license status ("long form") from Department of Motor Vehicles.

 - May not be older than six (6) months from date of the submission of this application; exception: currently enrolled Level III cadets at Yuba College
- Proof of Module III completion:
 - POST Profile -- [POST Profile Request](#) or Certificates from Yuba College ONLY
 - Instructor Verification for current Level III enrollment/pending successful completion (if applicable)
 - Proof completion of POST-constructed Comprehensive Module III End-of-Course Proficiency Test, if applicable--*Three years expired; see staff for more information*
- Proof of Current Medical Insurance (copy of insurance card or coverage)
- Proof of Agency Sponsorship/Affiliation, *if applicable*.
 - Must be on Agency Letterhead, signed by Chief, Sheriff, or designee.
 - Must state employment title and status
 - Must indicate that hiring process has cleared applicant for DOJ & Medical Clearance Requirements
 - PelletB will be required for ALL students as this is a graded criteria for entry; however, an agency sponsoring a student can indicate their request to waive this PelletB requirement in their sponsorship letter. The fully sponsored student's score will be converted to an automatic PASS on criteria score sheet until a PelletB score can be obtained at a later date, if required.
- Military Personnel will provide a copy of their military ID or their DD214.



Enrollment, Criminal Background and Medical Clearance will not be required until accepted to attend.

- Yuba College Application Process (*must have YC Student ID prior to completing academy application*)
 - Completing Yuba College Application does not confirm academy attendance
 - Students Attending Yuba College Now – No YC Application will be needed

You will access the application by completing Step One under ‘Apply Now’. Please be advised the application is a 2-step process through CCC Apply. First you create your CCC ID. A CCC ID is not your student ID number for Yuba College.

BEGIN CLEARANCE PROCESS BETWEEN JULY 17-20, 2017

- No felony or misdemeanor convictions in any state or military court that would restrict possession of a firearm [PC 29800/29805]. Complete a Live Scan fingerprint check through the California Department of Justice to obtain a criminal history clearance for firearms eligibility. Currently enrolled Level III cadets will not need to provide another DOJ clearance. **All others will need 90 day current clearance. You will need to process your DOJ prints IMMEDIATELY upon acceptance in to the academy.**
- Obtain medical clearance by a qualified health provider. You will use the Yuba College medical clearance form and have it signed by your provider and returned by deadline date established. Currently enrolled Mod III cadets will not need to provide another medical clearance. All others will need 12 month current clearance.

EQUIPMENT & UNIFORMS:

- Students must provide their own uniforms. Details will be provided in the Application/Forms Link for Mod II Academy.

BOOKS & MATERIALS:

- Training materials will be available for purchase on-line, through the Follett Bookstore or provided by the Public Safety Program. Details will be provided in the Application/Forms Link for Mod II Academy.
- The Academy Rules and Regulation Link will be made available on our website for review; additionally, a copy will be provided during orientation.
